By Shuttle:
The Noguchi Museum will provide shuttle service on Saturday, June 25 and Sunday, June 26.

The bus leaves Manhattan for the Museum from the northeast corner of Park Avenue and 70th Street (in front of the Asia Society). The return bus leaves from the entrance to The Noguchi Museum at 9-01 33rd Road at Vernon Boulevard (across the street and two blocks from Socrates Sculpture Park) and discharges passengers at the Asia Society.

The trip takes approximately thirty minutes one-way. Fare: $\$ 5.00$ for one-way, $\$ 10.00$ for round-trip.

Shuttle Schedule:
Pick-ups in Manhattan (in front of Asia Society) at 12:30 pm, 1:30 pm, 2:30 pm, and 3:30 pm. Return trips from The Noguchi Museum at 1:00 pm, 2:00 pm, 3:00 pm, 4:00 pm, and 5:00 pm. The bus holds twenty-five passengers, seated on a first come, first served basis.
